CHECK-IN

Check-in will take place at the front desk of the unit to which you are assigned. Your emailed confirmation will confirm your unit assignment. The Unit 1 Residence Halls are located at 2650 Durant Avenue, Berkeley CA. The Unit 2 Residence Halls are located at 2650 Haste Street, Berkeley CA. Please bring a government issued photo identification and your housing confirmation with you when you check in. At that time you will receive your room assignment and room key. Other information regarding the facilities will also be distributed to you.

Beginning Sunday, May 25, 2008, the unit offices will be open 8:00 am to 7:00 pm, Monday through Friday and 10:00 am to 3:00 pm on Saturday (except special hours as noted below on check-in weekends). The units' office hours may be extended during different periods of the summer. Please check the unit offices for a list of their hours when you arrive.

To check in after hours, call the staff person on duty. There is a campus phone located at the front of each building. Calling instructions for after hour check-ins will be posted on the doors.

CHECK-OUT

If your contract is for Session A, you must check out of the residence halls by 5:00 pm on Thursday, July 3, 2008. If your contract is for Session A&D, Session B, Session C or Session D, you must check out of the residence halls by 5:00 pm on Friday, August 15, 2008. Students with housing contracts for both Session A and Session D may stay over the nights of July 3 and 4, 2008. Please plan your travel arrangements accordingly. The final check out dates and times are not negotiable.

EARLY ARRIVALS AND LATE DEPARTURES

The occupancy dates for each session are not negotiable at the Unit 1 or Unit 2 Residence Halls. However, housing is available at the Stern Residence Hall through Summer Visitor Housing for those students who wish to arrive earlier or depart later than their session’s dates. Both single and double rooms are available at \$59.00 per night. Please note: Summer Visitor Housing is open from June 1, 2008 through the night of August 18, 2008 (check out by noon on August 19, 2008). PROGRAMMING

Your residence hall contract includes a non-refundable \$20.00 Programming Fee. The Programming Fee is used for recreational, educational and social activities. These activities may include films, dances, coffee hours, study breaks, excursions to local sites, intramural teams, cook-outs and more.

DINING SERVICES**Crossroads, Five On-Campus Retail Locations and One Residential Retail Location**

Summer Sessions residents will eat at the Crossroads dining facility at Channing Way and Bowditch Street near campus. This is the primary dining facility for your meal plan. Our residence hall dining service is buffet style and provides unlimited portions. A maximum of 21 meals per week will be served at Crossroads each week: 3 meals per day, Monday through Sunday except on May 26, 2008 (Memorial Day) and July 4, 2008 when only brunch and dinner will be served. **Meals are not available at Clark Kerr, Foothill or Café 3.**

Five on-campus retail locations offer a variety of grab-and-go and hot meal options. These locations include Golden Bear, Pat Brown's Grille, Ramona's Café, Terrace Café and The Pro Shop.



The Den, our residential retail location featuring Peet's Coffee & Tea, will be open for Summer Sessions.

The operating hours for Crossroads and the six retail locations will be provided at check-in. In addition, a campus map indicating the location of Crossroads and the retail locations will be provided.

The University may change the hours and/or locations of service within the University's reasonable discretion. Hours and menus may vary throughout the summer, but will be posted at Crossroads and the retail locations.

The Meal Plan

The Summer Sessions Residence Halls contract includes room and board. The contract may not be purchased without the meal plan. Meal plan “**points**” are the currency with which residents use their meal plan. Unused points cannot be refunded, cancelled or transferred to another session/semester.

Students will receive the following points:

A (1 st 6 Week)	528
A&D (12 Week)	1,056

D (2 nd 6 Week)	528

Meals at Crossroads are debited as follows:

Meal	Cost
Breakfast	5.50 Points
Lunch/Brunch	6.50 Points
Dinner	7.50 Points

Retail points have a purchasing power of \$1.00 each (calculated to the 1/100th). For example, a purchase of \$2.01 would cost 2.01 points.

There are no daily minimums or maximums. You can buy when you want. You may also use your points for as many guests as you want.

Additional points can be added up to one week prior to the end of the session to which you are enrolled. Points can be added in \$50.00 increments. \$50.00 would purchase 55 additional points. Unused additional points cannot be refunded, cancelled or transferred to another session/semester.

CAL 1 CARD

The Cal 1 Card is the campus identification card and will be magnetically encoded to allow access to the residence halls and your summer meal plan. There is also a debit account available on your Cal 1 Card that will allow you to add funds on-line and use those funds at various campus and off-campus locations, including all Cal Dining locations, Free Speech Movement Café, the campus bookstore, residence hall laundry facilities and various vending machines. NO MEAL SHALL BE PROVIDED WITHOUT PRESENTATION OF A VALID CAL 1 CARD OR CASH. THE CAL 1 CARDS ARE NONTRANSFERABLE.

If your card is damaged or demagnetized you should replace or have your card re-magnetized before entering the dining areas. You can obtain or replace your Cal 1 Card at the Cal 1 Card Office located at 180 Cesar Chavez Center, Lower Sproul Hall, Berkeley CA. The Cal 1 Card Office is open Monday through Friday 9:00 am to 5:00 pm. There is a \$25.00 non-refundable replacement fee for lost cards. There is no replacement fee for damaged cards. In order to avoid paying the replacement fee you must present and exchange the damaged card at the time of service.

Please note: To obtain your Cal 1 Card you will need to know or have your CalNet ID (student ID) number and an alternate form of identification (a current state ID, Driver's License or passport).

ROOM FURNISHINGS

Your room is furnished with an extra-long bed, 36"x80" mattress, a mattress pad, a pillow, two sheets, a bedspread, a pillowcase, a blanket, two bath towels, a wash cloth, a telephone, drapes, a desk, a chair, a wastebasket, a closet,

shelving and a reading lamp. Additional blankets and reading lamps are available at the front desk upon request. You will be responsible for laundering the linens during your stay. Please leave all items in your room when you check out. You will be billed for any missing items after your departure.

NO SMOKING

Smoking is not allowed in any interior area of the residence halls, dining facilities or exterior within 20 feet of building entrances.

WHAT TO BRING

There are a few items that you may want to bring with you to the residence halls: an alarm clock, a telephone answering machine, clothes hangers, and extra pillows and blankets.

The following items are not permitted in the residence halls: pets, waterbeds, weapons of any kind, illegal drugs, candles, incense, flame-lit lamps, barbecues, halogen lamps or cooking equipment. ACADEMIC SERVICES CENTER

All residents are eligible to use the Unit 2 Academic Services Center, featuring multiple PCs and Macintosh Workstations supporting popular software (i.e. Microsoft Office Suite, Adobe Photoshop, Illustrator, etc.) and installed with a link to the campus library catalogs, email and the World Wide Web. The Unit 2 Academic Services Center is located in the Central Building. Staff is available to answer questions and troubleshoot problems. You can sign up for a free Academic Services Center Account to use the computers. Black/white and color ink jet printing is available for a nominal fee.

IN-ROOM ETHERNET CONNECTIONS

All residents are eligible for free wired In-Room Ethernet Connections. In order to connect to the network, your computer will need a network card - also called a Network Interface Card (NIC), an Ethernet card, or an Ethernet adapter. You will also need to bring your own Ethernet cable (often referred to as a category 5 cable) with an RJ45 connector (approximately 25 ft.).

All computers connected to the campus network MUST meet campus minimum security standards which require:

- updated antivirus software
- automatic software patching (e.g. Windows Update)
- a personal firewall
- a strong administrator password

Computers that do not meet these requirements may have their network connections disabled. For detailed information about the requirements and how to meet them, please visit ResComp's BeSecure website at:

Residential Computing supports Ethernet connections for computers running Windows XP/Vista and Macintosh OS 10.4 or higher. Windows 95/98/Me and Mac OS 10.3 and below are not allowed on the network as they do not meet campus minimum security standards.

When you arrive, you will need to visit the Unit 2 Computing Center to register for your In-Room Connection. If you have problems setting up your connection, our Residential Computing Consultants can help. ResComp's helpdesk services include scheduled appointments, office hours in the Unit 2 Computing Center, our helpdesk phone line at (510) 642-HELP (4357), and helpdesk email at summer-helpdesk@rescomp.berkeley.edu.

Wireless connections: ResComp provides wireless coverage to registered computers in some lounges and common areas, but not in resident rooms. For the latest hot spots, please visit:

Students are allowed to bring and set up their own wireless routers in their rooms, but must make sure to secure the routers as the student is responsible for all traffic that passes through their router. HOUSEKEEPING

You are responsible for cleaning your own room. You may borrow a vacuum cleaner from your Resident Assistant or the Front Desk at the unit. Daily housekeeping services are provided, except on May 26 and July 4, 2008, for the common areas; lounges, hallways, stairwells and restrooms.

LAUNDRY AND VENDING

Coin operated laundry machines are located on the 2nd, 6th and 8th floors of each residence hall building. Snack and beverage vending machines are located on the ground floors of each residence hall building.

TELEPHONE SERVICE

Telephones with campus and local dialing service (within a 12-mile radius) are provided in each room at no extra charge. Long distance phone calls must be charged to calling cards or major credit cards. Telephones and dialing instructions are provided in each room. Continuing University of California, Berkeley students may request a telephone authorization code from Residence Telephone Service (510) 643-7000.

PARKING

There is limited street parking around the Berkeley Campus, however, parking is available in University parking lots and public transportation is quite efficient. The City of Berkeley requires a permit to park on city streets. Vehicles without permits are subject to two-hour parking restrictions between 8:00 am and 7:00 pm from Monday through Saturday. AIRPORT TRANSPORTATION

Shuttle service is available from the Oakland International Airport and the San Francisco International Airport. Most shuttles offer door-to-door service to the residence halls, upon request. Reservations are required. For information, costs, and reservations, call:

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART) is available from the Oakland International Airport and the San Francisco International Airport to the Downtown Berkeley BART station. For the Oakland International Airport take the "Air-BART" shuttle from the terminal to the Coliseum BART station. From the Coliseum BART station take the Richmond bound BART train to the Downtown Berkeley Station on Shattuck Avenue. From the San Francisco International Airport take BART to either the Oakland City Center/12 Street Station or the MacArthur Station. Transfer to the Richmond bound train. Take the Richmond bound train to the Downtown Berkeley Station on Shattuck Avenue. Fares are posted in the

stations. (For more information regarding BART visit their website at <http://www.bart.gov/index.asp>.) From Shattuck Avenue take the #51 southbound AC Transit bus to the Unit 2 Residence Halls (College Avenue and Haste Street).
